They are ambitious, working hard to get ahead, and willing to take some risks to achieve their goals. The recession has impacted their financial well-being, but they are optimistic. Their homes are new; their families are young. And this is one of the fastest-growing markets in the country.

Who We Are

This is the new growth market, with a profile similar to the original: young professionals with families that have opted to trade up to the newest housing in the suburbs. The original Boomburbs neighborhoods began growing in the 1990s and continued through the peak of the housing boom. Most of those neighborhoods are fully developed now. This is an affluent market but with a higher proportion of mortgages. Rapid growth still distinguishes the Boomburbs neighborhoods, although the boom is more subdued now than it was 10 years ago. So is the housing market. Residents are well-educated professionals with a running start on prosperity.

Our Neighborhood

Growth markets are in the suburban periphery of large metropolitan areas. Young families are married with children; average household size is 3.25.
 Homeownership is 84% (Index 134), with the highest rate of mortgages, 71.5%.
 Primarily single-family homes in new neighborhoods, 66% built since 2000.
 Median home value is \$350,000. Lower housing vacancy rate at 3.7%. The cost of affordable new housing comes at the expense of one of the longest commutes to work, over 30 minutes average, including a disproportionate number (33.6%) commuting across county lines.

Socioeconomic Traits

Well-educated young professionals, 55% are college graduates. High labor force participation at 71.3%; most households have more than two workers. Longer commute times from the suburban growth corridors have created more home workers. Well connected, own the latest devices and understand how to use them efficiently; biggest complaints —too many devices and too many intrusions on personal time. Financial planning is well under way for these professionals.

Market Profile

· Boomburbs residents prefer late model imports, primarily SUVs, and also luxury cars and minivans. This is one of the top markets for the latest in technology, from smartphones to tablets to internet connectable televisions. Style matters in the Boomburbs, from personal appearance to their homes. These consumers are still furnishing their new homes and already remodeling. Enjoy gardening but more often contract for home services. Physical fitness is a priority, including club memberships and home equipment. Leisure includes a range of activities from sports (hiking, bicycling, swimming, golf) to visits to theme parks or water parks. Residents are generous supporters of charitable organizations.

Who We Are

Exurbanites residents are now approaching retirement but showing few signs of slowing down. They are active in their communities, generous in their donations, and seasoned travelers. They take advantage of their proximity to large metropolitan centers to support the arts but prefer a more expansive home style in less crowded neighborhoods. They have cultivated a lifestyle that is both affluent and urbane.

Our Neighborhood

 Established neighborhoods (most built between 1970 and 1990) found in the suburban periphery of large metropolitan markets. A larger market of empty nesters, married couples with no children; average household size is 2.50. Primarily single-family homes with a high median value of \$423,400, most still carrying mortgages. Higher vacancy rate at 9%.

Socioeconomic Traits

· Residents are college educated; more than half have a bachelor's degree or higher; nearly 81% have some college education. This labor force is beginning to retire. 1 in 3 households currently receive Social Security or retirement income. Labor force participation has declined to less than 60%. More of the residents prefer self-employment or working from home. Consumers are more interested in quality than cost. They take pride in their homes and foster a sense of personal style. Exurbanites residents are well connected, using the Internet for everything from shopping to managing their finances. Sociable and hardworking, they still find time to stay physically fit.

Market Profile

 Exurbanites residents' preferred vehicles are late model luxury cars or SUVs. Active supporters of the arts and public television/radio. Attentive to ingredients, they prefer natural or organic products. Gardening and home improvement are priorities, but they also use a number of services, from home care and maintenance to personal care. Financially active with wide-ranging investments, these investors rely on financial planners, extensive reading, and the Internet to handle their money.

Who We Are

Workday Drive is an affluent, familyoriented market with a country flavor. Residents are partial to new housing away from the bustle of the city but close enough to commute to professional job centers. Life in this suburban wilderness offsets the hectic pace of two working parents with growing children. They favor time-saving devices, like banking online or housekeeping services, and familyoriented pursuits.

Our Neighborhood

 Workday Drive residents prefer the suburban periphery of metropolitan areas. Predominantly single family, homes are in newer neighborhoods, 34% built in the 1990s, 31% built since 2000. Owner-occupied homes have high rate of mortgages at 68%, and low rate vacancy at 4%. Median home value is \$257,400. Most households are married couples with children; average household size is 2.97. Most households have 2 or 3 vehicles; long travel time to work including a disproportionate number commuting from a different county

Socioeconomic Traits

Education: 40.5% college graduates; more than 72% with some college education. High labor force participation rate at 71%; 2 out of 3 households include 2+ workers. Connected, with a host of wireless devices, anything that enables convenience, like banking, paying bills, or even shopping online. Well insured and invested in a range of funds, from savings accounts or bonds to stocks. Carry a higher level of debt, including first and second mortgages and auto loans.

Market Profile

· Most households own at least 2 vehicles; the most popular types are minivans and SUVs. Family-oriented purchases and activities dominate. like 4+ televisions. movie purchases or rentals, children's apparel and toys, and visits to theme parks or zoos. Outdoor activities and sports are characteristic of life in the suburban periphery. They attend sporting events, as well as participate in them like bicycling, jogging, golfing, and boating. Home maintenance services are frequently contracted, but these families also like their gardens and own the tools for minor upkeep, like lawn mowers, trimmers, and blowers.

Who We Are

Southern Satellites is the second largest market found in rural settlements but within metropolitan areas located primarily in the South. This market is typically slightly older, settled marriedcouple families, who own their homes. Two-thirds of the homes are singlefamily structures; almost a third are mobile homes. Median household income and home value are below average. Workers are employed in a variety of industries, such as manufacturing, health care, retail trade, and construction, with higher proportions in mining and agriculture than the US. Residents enjoy country living, preferring outdoor activities and DIY home projects.

Our Neighborhood

About 78% of households are owned.
 Married couples with no children are the dominant household type, with a number of multigenerational households. Most are single-family homes (67%), with a number of mobile homes. Most housing units were built in 1970 or later. Most households own 1 or 2 vehicles, but owning 3+ vehicles is common.

Socioeconomic Traits

Education: almost 40% have a high school diploma only; 45% have college education. Labor force participation rate is 59.1%, slightly lower than the US. These consumers are more concerned about cost rather than quality or brand loyalty. They tend to be somewhat late in adapting to technology. They obtain a disproportionate amount of their information from TV, compared to other media.

Market Profile

Usually own a truck; likely to service it themselves. Frequent the convenience store, usually to fill up a vehicle with gas. Typical household has a satellite dish. Population by Age








Employment Count by Industry




How People Get to Work




